COUNTRY PROFILE REPORT OF ITJ DIVISION, DGCI&S INDIA-THAILAND BILATERAL TRADE RELATIONS

INTRODUCTION & BRIEF ECONOMIC OVERVIEW

The Kingdom of Thailand lies in South-East Asia. It is bordered to the west and north by Myanmar (Burma), to the north-east by Laos and to the south-east by Cambodia. Thailand extends southward, along the Isthmus of Kra, to the Malay Peninsula, where it borders Malaysia. The isthmus, shared with Myanmar, gives Thailand a short coastline on the Indian Ocean, and the country also has a long Pacific coastline on the Gulf of Thailand. Thailand is a member of the UN, WTO, BIS, Asian Development Bank and ASEAN.

2. The economy of Thailand is heavily export-dependent, with exports accounting for more than two-thirds of gross domestic product (GDP). Thailand is the second-largest economy in Southeast Asia, after Indonesia. As per available report of IMF Executive Board Concludes 2023 Article IV Consultation with Thailand January 22, 2024, Executive Directors of the IMF welcomed Thailand's post-pandemic economic recovery and commended the authorities for maintaining macroeconomic stability amidst multiple shocks. However, the recovery has been slower than in ASEAN peers and the outlook remains uncertain, with risks tilted to the downside. Given limited fiscal space and longstanding structural weaknesses, Directors encouraged the authorities to continue with gradual policy normalization in the near term, while implementing bold structural reforms to boost productivity and potential growth and building climate resilience.

FOREIGN TRADE

- 3. As per recent available inputs on WITS (World Integrated Trade Solution), the five major merchandise export partners of Thailand are United States, China, Japan, Vietnam and Malaysia. On the other hand five major import partners of Thailand are China, Japan, United States, UAE and Malaysia. Major five exported goods of Thailand are (i) Parts and accessories of automatic data process, (ii) Petroleum oils, etc, (excl. crude); preparation, (iii) Monolithic integrated circuits, digital, (iv) Gold in unwrought forms non-monetary and (v) Diesel powered trucks with a GVW not exceeding. On the other hand major five imported goods of Thailand (i) Petroleum oils and oils obtained from bituminous, (ii) Monolithic integrated circuits, digital, (iii) Gold in unwrought forms non-monetary, (iv) Natural gas, liquefied and (v) Transmission apparatus, for radioteleph incorpo.
- 4. Thailand's total exports in 2019 were of the order of US\$ 246,266 million. It has scaled upto US\$ 285,074 million in 2023. Exports from Thailand had increased by 17.43% in the year 2021 immediate after pandemic hit year. During the period from 2019 to 2023, the annual average compound rate of growth of exports was 3.73%.
- 5. Thailand's total imports in 2019 were of the order of US\$ 236,206 million and which has touched US\$ 288499 million mark in 2023 after having experienced a 12.72% decline in 2020 it had increased by 29.68% in the year 2021 over 2020 . During the period from 2019 to 2023, the annual average compound rate of growth of Imports was 5.13%.
- 6. Thailand runs an overall Balance of Trade surplus from 2019 to 2021 but faced two consecutive trade deficits in 2022 and 2023 and had scaled upto USD -3,425 million in 2023. During the period from 2019 to 2023, the annual average compound rate of growth of total volume of trade was 4.42%.

BILATERAL TRADE WITH INDIA

Merchandise Trade

7. India and Thailand share a longstanding history of friendship and cooperation and the bilateral trade and investment relationship between them has flourished and evolved over the years. Thailand ranked 25th as an export destination of India in FY 2023-24. India had exported to Thailand 1.15 % of it's total export value in FY2023-24. In the same financial year imports from Thailand was 1.47% of India's total import value. Thailand was the 18th largest import partner of India in FY 2023-24. Almost 1.34% of India's total

international trade value was between India and Thailand as has been recorded in DGCI&S data base for FY 2023-24.

- 8. Indo-Thailand total volume of bilateral trade in FY 2019-20 was of the order of US\$ 11,087.68 million. It has scaled upto US\$ 14,948.38 million in FY 2023-24. The annual compound growth rate of total volume comprising both exports and imports and with a tilt towards imports of trade during the period from 2019-20 to 2023-24 has been of the order of 7.76%.
- 9. It is seen from the available figures that between 2019-20 and 2023-24, India has had a deficit Balance of Trade with Thailand. Exports from India to Thailand increased steeply by 35.73% in FY2021-22 over the FY2020-21. The annual average compound rate of growth of Exports was 4.05% during the period under review. On the other hand, imports from Thailand to India increased significantly by a stupendous 64.24% in FY 2021-22 just after the pandemic hit year and followed by another increase of 19.94% in FY 2022-23. During the period from 2019-20 to 2023-24, the annual average compound rate of growth of imports was 9.92%.
- 10. Additionally, from Tables 4 & 5 presented below the following are stated:
- a. (i) **Pearl, Precs, Semiprecs Stones**, (ii) **IC Engine and Parts**, and (iii) **Marine Products** had occupied the top three slots in India's exports to Thailand in the year 2022-23. **Pearl, Preces, Semiprecs Stones**, had occupied the 11.98% share of India's total exports to Thailand.
- b. (i) **Plastic Raw Materials**; (ii) **Organic Chemicals** and (iii) **Vegetable Oils** were the three major commodities in India's imports list from Thailand in the year 2023-24. **Plastic Raw Materials**, had occupied the 11.61% share of India's total imports from Thailand.




